Parts of Speech: are words that perform different grammatical functions according to their positions in the sentence.

\'-Nouns: are words that are used to name people, places, animals, ideas, and things.

Nouns can be classified into two main categories:

A-Proper nouns: name a specific person, place, day, month, event, or thing. We use a capital letter to start a proper noun.

EX:

- -I visited **Mosul** last week.
- -Babylon is a city in Iraq.
- -Ahmed is a successful student.
- -The Earth moves round the Sun.
- -The tourists went to Sawa lake in Samawah.

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B-common Nouns: refer to a generic item, group, or place. Common nouns are not capitalized unless they appear at the beginning of a sentence.

EX:

- -I bought a **pen** yesterday.
- -I am going to **school**.
- -The workers arrived at the factory.
- -The car is out of fuel.

Nouns are also categorized into singular and plural.

C-Singular Nouns: are words that are used to name a single person, place, animal, bird, or object.

EX:

- -There is a **person** in front of our house.
- -That is my **daughter**.
- -I found a wounded **sparrow** in the bush.
- -He is a nice **friend**.

D-Plural Nouns: refer to a number of people, places, animals or things. Nouns are made plural by adding an s

EX:

- -I need some apples. (apple)
- -Did you find the **boxes** you were looking for? (box)
- -Jassim read two stories yesterday. (story)
